

Bill passed away in March 2025 after a lifetime of extraordinary philanthropy and devoted service to Dallas Theater Center. A Life Trustee and twice Board Chair, Bill and his beloved wife, Linda, shared a profound and enduring bond with DTC—one of their earliest dates was attending the opening night of the Kalita Humphreys Theater in 1959, beginning

more than six decades of generosity and leadership.

In both good times and hard times, Bill listened with care, navigated challenges with wisdom and grace, and offered counsel with strength, warmth, and humor. DTC's highest honor, the Linda and Bill Custard Award, is bestowed each year upon someone whose impact has left an indelible mark on our theater's history. All of us at DTC who follow in his footsteps strive to live up to his remarkable example. As Shakespeare wrote, "He was a man, take him for all in all, I shall not look upon his like again."

**Dotty Otley** (Mrs. Clackett) makes a welcome return to the stage to create the role of Mrs. Clackett after playing Mrs. Hackett, Britain's most famous lollipop lady ("Ooh, I can't 'ardly 'old me lolly up!") in over 320 episodes of TV's "On the Zebras." Her many stage appearances include her critically acclaimed portrayal of Fru Såckett, the comic char in Strindberg's *Scenes from the Charnelhouse*. Her first appearance ever (?) was in a school production of *Henry IV Part I* – as the old bag-lady, Mrs. Duckett.

**Belinda Blair** (Flavia Brent) has been on the stage since the age of four, when she made her debut in *Sinbad the Sailor* at the old Croydon Hippodrome as one of Miss Toni Tanner's Ten Tapping Tots. She subsequently danced her way round this country, Southern Africa, and the Far East in shows like *ZippedyDooda!* and *Here Come les Girls!* More recently she has been seen in such comedy hits as *Don 't Mr. Duddle!, Who's Been Sleeping in My Bed?*, and *Twice Two Is Sex.* She is married to scriptwriter Terry Wough, who has contributed lead-in material to most of TV's chat shows. They have two sons and three retrievers.

**Garry Lejeune** (Roger Tramplemain) while still at drama school won the coveted Laetitia Daintyman Medal for Violence. His television work includes "Police!," "Crime Squad," "Swat," "Forensic," and "The Nick," but he is probably best-known as Cornetto, the ice-cream salesman who stirs the hearts of all the lollipop ladies in "On the Zebras."

**Selsdon Mowbray** (Burglar) first "trod the boards" at the age of 12 playing Lucius in a touring production of *Julius Caesar*, with his father, the great Chelmsford Mowbray, in the lead. Since then he has served in various local reps, and claims to have appeared with every company to have toured Shakespeare in the past half-century, working his way up through the Mustardseeds and the various Boys and Sons of, to the Balthazars, Benvolios, and Le Beaus; then the Slenders, Trinculos, Snouts, and Froths; and graduating to the Scroops, Poloniuses, and Aguecheeks. His most recent film appearance was as Outraged Pensioner in *Green Willies*.

**Frederick Fellows** (Philip Brent) has appeared in many popular television series, including "Calling Casualty," "Cardiac Arrest!," "Out-Patients," and "In-Patients." On stage he was most recently seen in the controversial all-male version of *The Trojan Women*. He is happily married, and lives near Crawley, where his wife breeds pedigree dogs. "If she ever leaves me," he says, "it will probably be for an Irish wolfhound!"

**Brooke Ashton** (Vicki) is probably best known as the girl wearing nothing but "good, honest, natural froth" in the Hauptbahnhofbrau lager commercial. Her television appearances range from Girl at Infants' School in "On the Zebras" to Girl in Massage Parlour in "On Probation." Cinemagoers saw her in *The Girl in Room 14*, where she played the Girl in Room 312.

**Robin Housemonger** (Author) was born in Worcester Park, Surrey, into a family "unremarkable in every way except for an aunt with red hair who used to sing all the high twiddly bits from *The Merry Widow* over the tea-table." He claims to have been the world's most unsuccessful gents hosiery wholesaler, and began writing "to fill the long hours between one hosiery order and the next." He turned this experience into his very first play, *Socks Before Marriage*, which ran in the West End for nine years. Two of his subsequent plays, *Briefs Encounter* and *Hanky Panky*, broke box office records in Perth, Western Australia. *Nothing On* is his seventeenth play.

**Lloyd Dallas** (Director) "Read English at Cambridge, and stagecraft at the local benefits office." He has directed plays in most parts of Britain, winning the South of Scotland Critics' Circle Special Award in 1969. In 1972 he directed a highly successful season for the National Theatre of Sri Lanka. In recent years he has probably become best known for his brilliant series of Shakespeare in Summer productions in the parks of the inner London boroughs.

**Tim Allgood** (Company and Stage Manager) Tim trained for a career in Market Research and became interested in the theatre only through a chance holiday visit to a local production of *There's a Girl in My Soup*. He got himself taken on by the company as an assistant stage manager before he realized that the girl in question not only was in the soup, but also married with two growing children! During a production of *Hamlet* at the Lyceum, Portsmouth, he took over the part of Polonius at short notice, but subsequently found himself more in demand on the technical side. His most recent job was the *Betrothed*, a thriller by Sam Brennicle, on the tour prior to its West End opening in December 1980 and again on the tour which followed the conclusion of its successful West End run in January 1981.

**Poppy Norton-Taylor** (Assistant Stage Manager) Poppy is from a family found more often on the boards of leading companies than on the boards with touring companies. Her father is chairman of the European Breweries, but has been terribly sweet about it all—so far! After attending schools in Cheltenham and Montreux, she found life far too full to leave time for work. So this is her first job and she is enjoying the challenge enormously. Her hobbies include riding, skiing, tennis, reading good books, and loving anything small and furry.

When *Noises Off* premiered in London in 1982, it instantly cemented playwright Michael Frayn's reputation as a master of farce. The play transferred to Broadway in 1983, winning the Tony Award for Best Play. Since then, it has been revived around the world, cherished by audiences and actors alike for its dizzying comic structure and its loving, merciless send-up of the theater itself. Reviewing the original Broadway production, Frank Rich of *The New York Times* wrote that *Noises Off* is "the funniest play written in my

lifetime," a verdict that has been echoed by generations of delighted theatergoers.

In 1992, *Noises Off* was adapted into a star-studded film directed by Peter Bogdanovich and featuring Michael Caine, Carol Burnett, Christopher Reeve, and John Ritter. Unlike the stage play, which has been widely hailed as a masterpiece for more than 40 years, the movie received poor reviews and left audiences lukewarm — underscoring how the unique joys of farce belong to the communal, live experience of theater. Indeed, *Noises Off* comes fully alive only onstage.

As a genre, farce depends on the shared rhythm of actors and audience, the collective gasp at a near-miss, and the rolling waves of laughter that build in real time when we are all together in the same room. This requires not only perfect timing but also extraordinary skill, generosity, and stamina from actors. At Dallas Theater Center, we are especially fortunate that this production features members of our Diane & Hal Brierley Resident Acting Company, whose artistry is at the very heart of our work. Their expertise brings to life both the hilarity and the humanity of Frayn's creation. And most importantly, *Noises Off* gives us the rare joy of laughing together – sharing a collective, cathartic burst of delight in a darkened theater.

Beyond *Noises Off*, this is a season of transformation and ambition at Dallas Theater Center. By the end of 2025 we will welcome a new Enloe/Rose Artistic Director, ushering in the next chapter of our artistic leadership. This season also brings an extraordinary range of productions, from the world premiere of *Malcolm X and Redd Foxx Washing Dishes at Jimmy's Chicken Shack in Harlem*, written by our Interim Artistic Director, Jonathan Norton, to a grand new staging of *Ragtime*, produced in association with the Sexton Institute for Musical Theatre at SMU Meadows School of the Arts. And we are expanding our education programs to include year-round offerings for young people of all ages and experience. While *Noises Off* has been delighting audiences at the Kalita, our new after-school program, Next Stage, has filled the building with acting, singing, and dancing from an energetic group of elementary and middle school students. If you know a young person with a spark for theater, we've got a spotlight waiting just for them to shine—and plenty of applause when they do.
